When you are not able to complete the essential functions and tasks it is even more challenging.


Carolyn has been very open to customizing a position to meet their business needs and the needs of their Employees.

Carolyn hired a young lady, Madison, with an Autism spectrum disorder.

When she interviewed for a housekeeping position and learned of Madison's needs she was willing to adjust the number of rooms. Madison learns best through repetition, tasks broken down in smaller steps and at a much slower pace in the beginning. Working in housekeeping shifts can vary. Carolyn was open to scheduling Madison weekdays only.

This allowed a Job Coach to work with Madison ensuring consistency and giving clear and concise instruction.

As Madison became more comfortable with her daily tasks and time management skills improved more rooms were added on.



This was a long process, but Holiday Inn could see Madison's ability, looked past the barriers and could see steady growth.

Today, Madison's room numbers are up to industry standards and she can be scheduled any day of the week.

Madison has celebrated 1+ year as a Holiday Inn employee.

It did not start or stop with Madison. Holiday Inn has hired 5 individuals in total through Jobs Unlimited.

Their last hire, Ian is one of their best employees!



JOBS UNLIMITED

Jobs Unlimited is a not-for-profit organization providing employment and work experience opportunities to adults with intellectual disabilities in the greater Fredericton area.

Jobs Unlimited formally started in 1980, however its historical roots go back to the early 1960's when parents of children with intellectual disabilities organized to create vocational training for students graduating from Murray F. Humes School, a segregated school operated by volunteers to provide educational instruction for children who were developmentally delayed.

We presently serve some 750 individuals in various work capacities in the community. We share a strong belief in the dignity of work. Our mandate is to provide meaningful employment to individuals who face significant employment barriers due to their disabilities. Jobs Unlimited provides long-term support and we offer our individuals a daily experience that is fulfilling and one that provides a sense of selfworth and increased independence through work. Over the years, we have partnered with more than 800 employers, and we currently have a staff of 92.

Our organization is committed to promoting inclusion in the workplace. We advocate on behalf of our clients to secure work opportunities. The value of social participation and contribution is of paramount importance for the self-esteem of the individuals who we serve. Our service delivery model for an individual with intellectual challenges involves close partnerships and collaboration with many key stakeholders. In addition to the individual, we work closely with their families and/or their caregivers, employers, funders, various provincial government departments, health care agencies, transportation providers, our staff, board members and the community at large.

Jobs Unlimited has grown and developed since its inception, in a great part with the support of Fredericton's employers. These employers in the business community, public sector, and other not-for-profit organizations have provided the opportunities that allow the individuals whom we serve to flourish. Employers in return receive the benefit of dedicated, diligent and appreciative workers, whose enthusiasm provides a great benefit to the workplace. These same workers, if not given the opportunity, might otherwise face a daily life void of social interaction, participation, skill development and freedom from personal success.

In order to achieve an increased level of self-reliance and sustainability as an organization, Jobs Unlimited developed several social enterprises over 30 years ago. They are The Deli Connection, York Street Courier, 6 Color Copy and The Mail Bag. These small businesses actively engage Jobs Unlimited participants while providing market-quality products and services. All work has dignity. The individuals whom we serve look forward to working at their level of abilities. Our individuals are employed in diverse sectors in various capacities. My name is Paul Morrell. I grew up in Minto NB and graduated from Minto High School in 1991.

School was not a great experience as I struggled both academically and socially.

I did not get a quality education, graduating with very low reading and writing abilities

I have a complicated neurological past, suffering from seizures since birth.

I spent a big part of my life working for my parents in the family owned restaurant.

I had a successful operation, removal of the left temporal lobes that ceased the seizures, but my limitations remained. Life was hard.

I worked many areas such as the food industry, furniture restoration, merchandising and housekeeping.

Even though I was gaining skills I just did not feel any of the positions were the right fit, feeling unengaged in general.

I connected with Jobs Unlimited and Post-Secondary Education Training and Labor to help plan out my career options.

Post-Secondary was offering a program, WES: aimed at helping adults seeking employment that require additional essential skills to succeed.

I was sent for an assessment and results came back that I would benefit from the program.

I worked on the basics: reading, writing, numeracy, document use and digital literacy. Wow, this opened a whole new world for me.

I successfully completed the first component and it was a big boost to my self-esteem. Still undecided of what I was looking for in a career, I returned to WES. This time I focused on communication and teamwork. I was standing in front of a class speaking, reading out loud to my classmates, pushed out of my comfort zone.

I left the program with confidence, feeling determined to turn my passion into a business, offering a broad range of cleaning and maintenance services.

With the guidance of Job Unlimited, Post-Secondary Education Training and Labor and CBDC I submitted a business plan.

September 2019 my dream became a reality, Helping Hands was opened. I like making decisions, have the flexibility to start as early or late as I want, and I have the customer service contact. I am a proud small business owner.

CLIENT SPOTLIGHT

23-year old Jesse Canney is from Durham Bridge, NB.

From a very young age Jesse showed a strong interest in swimming. Because his severe Autism prevented him from participating in regular group swim lessons, his parents enrolled him in private swimming lessons when he was 7-years old.

He joined the Capital Region Special Olympics swim team at age 11. In 2012, at age 15, his Special Olympics coach realized Jesse's swimming potential and advised he go competitive. He then joined the Fredericton Aquanauts Swim Team (FAST). It didn't take long for Jesse to fit in with the generic swimmers despite his intellectual disability. Jesse trains 8 times per week with FAST, 1 per week with Special Olympics and 3 personal training sessions per week.

Jesse has broken all NB Para Provincial records in his S14 classification and has competed in countless team meets.

In August 2017, Jesse competed at the Canada Games in Winnipeg, Manitoba bringing home 2 silver medals in the 200m individual medley and the 100m butterfly and 1 bronze medal in the 100m backstroke.

In August 2018, Jesse went to Special Olympics Nationals in Antigonish, NS and was a 5-time medalist, winning gold in the 400m freestyle & 100m backstroke, silver in the 200m freestyle & 200m Individual Medley, and bronze in the 100m butterfly.





Jesse found out in September 2018 that he had been selected to Special Olympics Team Canada! In March 2019, he travelled with Team Canada to Dubai, United Arab Emirates for Special Olympics World Games where he competed in the fastest heat of the distance events & won gold in the 800m & 1500m freestyle & a silver in the 400m freestyle. To top it off, his relay team won gold in the 200m medley relay.

The 2019 World Games were the largest sports and social inclusion event that this planet has ever seen, showcasing and advancing a world of full inclusion for people with intellectual disabilities in sports, education, health and leadership. It was the first time a Special Olympics' premier event was held in the Middle East.

Organizers welcomed more than 7,500 athletes representing more than 190 nations competing in 24 Olympic-style sports with the support of 3,000 coaches, 20,000 volunteers and as many as 500,000 spectators.
